You are likely to be eligible to receive a Blue Badge without further assessment if you can provide evidence of the entitlement described in the application form and can provide proof of your identity and residency.

Part 9

You may be eligible for a Blue Badge, but your eligibility will need to be assessed by your local authority. This may mean that they ask you to attend a mobility assessment.

Part 10

You may be eligible for a Blue Badge, but your eligibility will need to be assessed by your local authority. This may mean that they seek further information from healthcare professionals.

You should only complete sections 1, 4 & 6 of Application Form

Part 11

You may be eligible for a Blue Badge, but your eligibility will need to be assessed by your local authority. This may mean that they seek further information from healthcare professionals.

You should only complete sections 1, 5 & 6 of Application Form

Part 12

You are not eligible to receive a Blue Badge, as your main residence is not in Clackmannanshire.

Part 13
