<u>1.0 Welcome</u>	
Dick welcomed everybody to the Annual General Meeting of the	
Clackmannanshire Access Forum.	
<u>1.1 Apologies</u>	
Martin reported that he had received apologies from James	
Cullens, Brian Poett and Sir Robert Stewart.	
1.2 Approval of draft note from 2015 AGM	
David A proposed that the note from last years AGM was	
approved. This was seconded by Eric.	
<u>1.3 Report on the work and achievements of the Forum</u>	
Dick gave the following report:	

"2015 was another busy year for the Clackmannanshire Access Forum.

The Forum met on 3 occasions after last years AGM - in May, September and December. It also held site visits to Fishcross in September and attended a Public meeting on the subject of Access Rights within the area of Fishcross.

At last years AGM, Brian Poett stood down but was re-elected to the Land Managers Group. 3 new members were elected to the Forum - John Hutcheson and Barbara Maddox were elected to the Users Group, and Alison Fox was elected to the Communities Group. 3 vacancies exist in the Agency and advisory group. Dick Clark was elected as Chair.

The Forum has become very aware of the changing use of the countryside and how the Core Path Network is being accessed by ALL authorised users and contributing to the well being and connection to Communities within the County. This has contributed to an increase of groups enjoying the diverseness of the area with advantages to a greater understanding of it being understood. We will continue to maintain as a Forum on the ever changing need by consensus in advising the Council on matters of Access with an emphasis of fairness to all users and respect of ownership of land.

The Forum advised the Council on signage relating to deer movements on core path 138 at Harviestoun and on addressing sign duplication in the Hillfoots. Advice has also been given on dealing with problems of unauthorised motorbike activity and on updating the **Forum's Partnership Agreement**.

The Forum has been provided with information on a variety of access matters, including:

- Ochils Landscape Partnership which finished in November and delivered 22 different projects in the Hillfoots area, some of which will benefit access. EPIC (Enabling Projects in Clackmannanshire) has recently been created and will maintain the OLP projects for 10 years.
- Inner Forth Landscape Initiative which will deliver 4 access projects in Clackmannanshire. Works are currently taking place on the Walk to the Wetland and the Cambus Whisky and Wetland Wander projects.
- Inner Forth Landscape Initiative trainees who have undertaken improvement works to a number of paths bordering the Forth.

٠	Cycling and the work of the Cycling in Clackmannanshire Forum.	
•	Improvements to the National Cycle Network and the Greening Greenways initiative which has written Habitat Management Plans for the paths between Alva and Tillicoultry and between Alloa and Dollar. It will recruit and train volunteers to enhance the biodiversity of the verges bordering the network.	
•	Inclusive access and the work of the Clackmannanshire Disability Awareness Group.	
•	Outdoor access events that take place in Clackmannanshire - these vary in nature and include cross-country and hill running, cani-cross and equestrian events. Every effort is made to ensure that these events do not clash with land management operations, or with other events, and that participants comply with the Scottish Outdoor Access Code. My report illustrates that the Clackmannanshire Access Forum continues to play a key role in outdoor access provision in Clackmannanshire and with various new initiatives and developments in the county, such as the Inner Forth Landscape Initiative and new cycle path.	
There is an ongoing need for the Access Forum to provide the local authority with advice in and beyond 2016 and I would ask that that not only on Core Paths but also the Forum look towards the Assertion of the many Rights of Way within the County which are in danger of being lost."
