**1.0 Purpose**

- 1.1. The purpose of this report is to decide on the name of a new street.
- 1.2. In order to assist the decision process, the report sets out the results of the consultation exercise seeking a suggested name for a street in Alloa.
- 1.3. This development consists of the erection of 22 houses, 2 of these dwellings are accessed from Sunnyside Road and can be accommodated within its numbering sequence. The remaining 20 dwellings require a new single street name. A layout plan is enclosed at Appendix 1 for ease of reference.
- 1.4. Following careful consideration of the suggestions, having regard to the criteria for choosing names and taking cognisance of the Tri-Council Street Naming and Numbering Conventions, it is recommended that the name identified in Paragraph 2.1 be agreed.




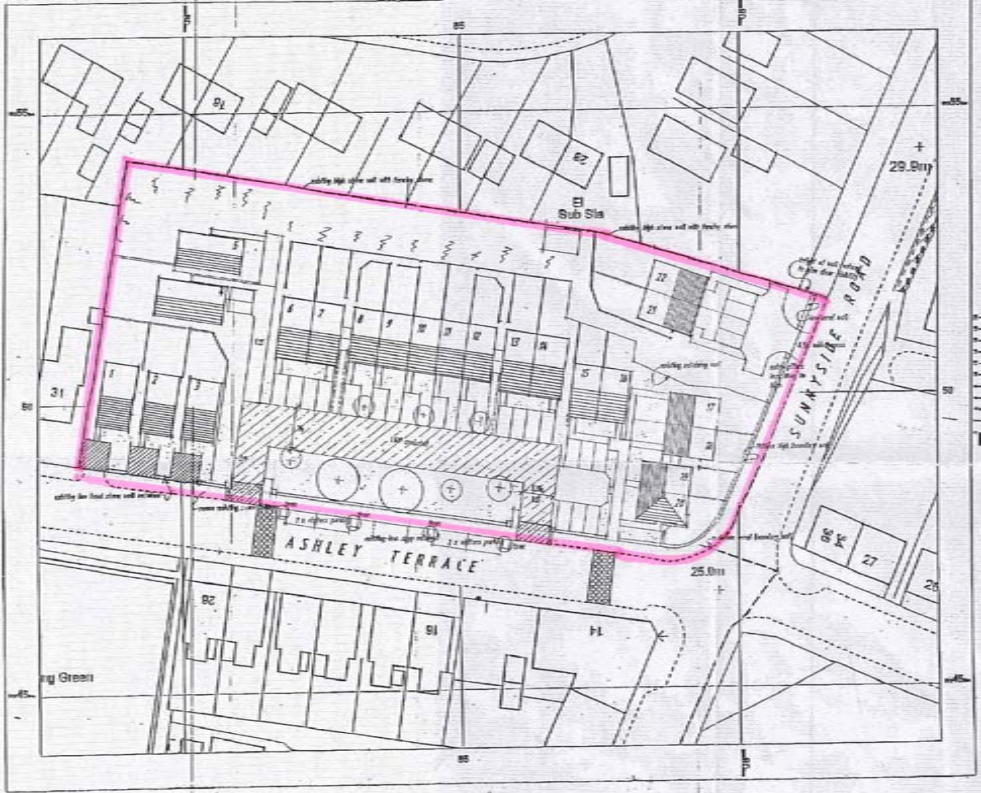

Alloa already has Forrester Grove, Paton Street, etc but nothing relating to her forename.</p> <p>Dr Findlater had the distinction of being Clackmannanshire's first medical Officer of Health.</p>
