Support was delivered in partnership with Ceteris who helped identify suitable property at



the Trade Centre in Bruce Street, Alloa giving them the extra space to produce and store more products to meet the demands of increasing orders.

Making It Work - Real Life Stories

A number of employees affected by the closure of Campbell's Interiors in Alva attended a PACE event at the Skills Development Scotland offices in Alloa. At this meeting a group of them talked to Clackmannanshire Works staff about the option of them starting their own business as a collective. They were given information on the support they could expect to receive from Clackmannanshire Works, and other agencies, which helped make the overall process seem less daunting.

The group already had skills, expertise, equipment and potential suppliers so Clackmannanshire Works helped them put their business plan together and Phoenix Soft Furnishings was born.

After working alongside Clacks First to help identify the right premises, Clackmannanshire Works were able to provide a tiered level of rental support for the first 3 months of trading. This allowed the business to free up their cash flow for buying stock, materials and equipment. The collective got on with the important business of letting contacts know that they were in business and to secure contracts for work.

Clackmannanshire Works staff helped to secure support from the Clackmannanshire Council Small Business Rates Relief Scheme, helped to ensure that the signage in the Business Park at Barnpark was up to date and also to inform them about the positive support they could receive from the Clacksfirst Business Improvement District.

The business continues to go from strength to strength.
