3.0 Alliance Feedback

3.1 Gillian Taylor summarised the business of the March meeting of the Alliance and the agenda of the June meeting. The Team noted that a paper from the BJSPT is required for the June meeting and that it would be in keeping with the working relationship between the Partnership Team and the Alliance itself for the Team's report to include 'actions' for the Alliance.

4.0 Tourism in Clackmannanshire - presentation

- 4.1 Liz Buchanan presented information on the work of Visit Scotland and on the shape of tourism in Clackmannanshire, highlighting the trend for promoting the tourism product and visitor experience rather than the area and the need to promote tourism collectively across Forth Valley, not just on a Clackmannanshire basis. She and Carolyn McGill answered questions on the constraints and opportunities for collectively developing the visitor economy in Clackmannanshire.
- 4.2 The Team observed the opportunities for developing the young workforce and agreed to investigate with Clacks Business how a Clackmannanshire 'Welcome Programme' can be taken forward.

5.1 The Team noted the drop in the number of representatives from business and agreed to route requests for representation on supporting groups through Clacks
