Key activities include:

Keeping information about <u>support</u> <u>measures for businesses</u> up to date on the website.

Administering and processing applications to the <u>Scottish Government Coronavirus</u> <u>Business Support Fund</u>

In addition the Council has:

- Developed specific local advice for food and drink businesses.
- Suspended commercial waste charges for non-operational businesses,
- Relaxed planning enforcement around food businesses
- Deferred the collection of rent for 30 small businesses, charities and community groups



- The support that Ceteris provides locally results in a £120 million net additional impact to our economy.
- Ceteris has over 160 tenant businesses and delivers the Business Gateway contract locally on behalf of Clackmannanshire Council, supporting over 200 businesses annually.
- Business Gateway resources are currently providing helpline services for businesses as well as a range of other supports.
- Ceteris have also created a <u>7-day rolling</u> <u>business support news feed</u> with information and stories from around the Forth Valley.



Alloa First is the Business Improvement District serving Alloa town centre. Keeping in contact to identify issues and:

- Providing a communications platform and focal point for our members regarding Scottish Government and Clackmannanshire Council initiatives and how they apply to you.
- Providing the communications to inform opening times, changes in service, offers and any other information.
- Our focus is on supporting our businesses however we can. If you have ideas as to how we could help you, or resources that you would find beneficial please let us know.



- Clacksfirst BID has taken the step to suspend BID Levy collection for the foreseeable future as we recognise the challenges that lie ahead for our members.
- The BID recycling service has been suspended however, if any of our members require a special uplift please contact <u>admin@clacksfirst.co.uk</u>
- Clacksfirst BID is in the process of applying to the COVID-19 BID Resilience Fund with the aim of supporting the local community, we will update on progress.
