5. Non-accessible content

Non-compliance with the accessibility regulations

 Most older PDF documents are not fully accessible to screen reader software, for example they may fail under

WCAG 2.1 Success Criterion 2.4.4: Link Purpose (In Context) or

WCAG 2.1 Success Criterion **2.4.9**: Link Purpose (Link Only)

We plan to address this for all new PDFs. When we publish new content we'll make sure our use of PDFs meets accessibility standards. To address existing PDFs would fall under the **Disproportionate Burden Exemption**.

Colour Contrast Accessibility Validator

This fails WCAG 2.1 Success Criterion 1.4.3: Test for Colour Contrast

As we have a number of web pages that may feel this criterion. to this immediately would fall under the **Disproportionate Burden Exemption**.

We plan to address this by 31st December 2021.
