recycle for Clackmannanshire





What's changing?

We are making improvements to your recycling and waste services so we can reduce carbon emissions and increase the efficiency of recycling in Clackmannanshire.

By separating paper, card and cardboard, it keeps it clean and dry and enables it to be recycled more easily, increasing its value.

By making these changes we are also helping to move Scotland closer to more consistent recycling across the country, meaning no matter where you live, recycling services will be easier to use and understand.

When is the change happening?

In August or September your new grey bin will be delivered for recycling paper, card and cardboard. Please start to use your grey bin after the last collection of your blue bin in September. From this point on please use your blue bin to recycle plastics, metals and cartons only.

From October your grey and blue bins will be collected every 4 weeks.

Your green bin for non-recyclable waste will also be collected every 4 weeks from October.

There is no change to your garden and food waste collections.

Please note if you live in a flat and share large communal bins then a similar new bin will be provided for you to recycle your paper and card from October.

Top Tips!

Remove all plastic inserts and polystyrene, as well as packing tape from boxes.









Place your recycling in your grey bin loose - no bagged waste. Place your bin at the kerbside by 7am.



3 Some properties may be provided with a shared, large, metal bin. Again the waste should be placed in the bin loose and not bagged.



Paper and card can be recycled into new newspapers and packaging.

Top tips!

Rinse, squash and place items loose in your blue bin.





Rinse and squash your cans, tins and plastic containers.



Don't forget to replace and recycle the lids.



Place your recycling materials in your bin loose - no bagged waste. Place your bin at the kerbside by 7am.



Some properties may be provided with a shared, large, metal bin. Again the waste should be placed in the bin loose and not bagged.

Food Waste

All types of unavoidable food waste – cooked and uncooked



Yes please

- Cheese and eggshells
- Fish, meat and bones
- ✓ Fruit, vegetables and peelings
- Tea bags and coffee grounds
- Rice, pasta and pizza
- ✓ Bread and cakes
- ✓ Pet foods
- ✓ Leftover food

Keeping your caddy clean

- You can empty your kitchen caddy as often as needed.
- Your kitchen caddy can be stored anywhere including in a cupboard or even outside.
- Avoid spillages by only filling the liner ¾ full before tying.
- Give your kitchen caddy a quick rinse after emptying it and then replace the liner.

- X Liquids and oils
- **X** Packaging

Top Tips!

When you're running out of liners please tie one to the handle of your kerbside caddy on collection day and we will leave you a new roll.





Put all cooked and uncooked food waste into your kitchen caddy which should be lined with a compostable liner, or newspaper.



When the liner is almost full, tie and remove it from the kitchen caddy.



Put the full liner into your kerbside caddy, then place it at the kerbside on your collection day and we will empty it every week.



Your food waste is then shredded and treated to turn it into valuable resources such as agricultural fertilisers and energy.

Brown garden waste bin

- ✓ Small twigs and branches
- ✓ Weeds & clippings
- Leaves
- Cut flowers and houseplants

No thanks

- **X** Plant pots or garden furniture
- **✗** Wood or coal ash
- **✗** Soil, compost or turf
- X Pet waste or cat litter
- **X** Gravel and stones
- **X** Large branches or logs

Garden waste Collected every B weeks

Did you know?

The garden waste from your brown bin is turned into compost and soil enhancer.

To have your garden waste collected, you first need to purchase a permit.

Non-recyclable waste

Items that cannot be recycled

- ✓ Polystyrene packaging
- Nappies
- Pet waste and animal bedding
- ✓ Vacuum dust
- Hygiene products
- Cold ashes
- Kitchen roll, serviettes and other items soiled with food.

There are some things that currently can't be recycled, but putting items in your green bin should be your last step when you're getting rid of waste.

Before putting anything in your green bin separate your waste to see if any of it can be recycled. This will help us reduce the amount of waste going to landfill and protect the environment.

Top Tips!

To help optimise space in your green bin please compact your waste and squeeze excess air out of bagged waste before putting it in your bin.



Top Tips!

Soft plastic packaging such as crisp packets and bread bags can be recycled at local shops. Check where you can take your soft plastics online at www.recyclenow.com/


Bulky Uplifts



Love Food Hate Waste

Scotland throws away 600,000 tonnes of food and drink from our homes every year, most of which could have been eaten.

This waste costs us over £1 billion a year, or £460 for the average household.

What can you do to reduce food waste?

- Meal plan and check cupboards before shopping
- Make a shopping list to help buy what you need
- Freeze or repurpose leftovers and freeze bread as it can be toasted straight from the freezer



Your Household Waste Recycling Centre

Clackmannanshire's Recycling Centre is located at Forthbank, Bowhouse Road, Alloa **FK10 1DA**.

The Centre is available to residents of Clackmannanshire to dispose of waste that cannot go into household bins or any excess recycling.

Among the materials and items that we send for recycling or re-use are:

Gas bottles

Batteries - car and household

Bicycles

Books

Engine oil (up to 10 litres)

Fluorescent tubes

Glass bottles and jars

Metal

Paper and cardboard

Plastics, metals and cartons

Walking aids – zimmers, crutches etc.

Garden waste

Soil and rubble

Textiles

Wood

Small electricals

Large electric units such as cookers, fridges, freezers, washing machines and tumble driers

Televisions and monitors

How to use your Recycling Centre

- Always separate your waste before visiting the site
- Do not bring unsorted waste in bags as many items can be recycled at the site
- Do not put recyclable materials in the landfill skips

Other material that can be disposed of

Mattresses

Carpets

Plastic toys and furniture Suites, settees and easy chairs

Items that we do not accept

Tyres and other car parts
Asbestos and other hazardous wastes
Commercial waste (without prepayment)

Frequently asked questions...

Q. Will you collect extra waste left alongside the provided bins?

A: No. All waste should be contained within the bin, with the lid closed. Excess waste can be taken to Forthbank recycling centre.

Q: Will my assisted service still be provided?

A: Yes, if we already help you with your wheeled bins, this service will automatically transfer to your new grey bin.

Q: Can I get smaller bins?

Q: Why don't you accept plastic bags for recycling?

A: Plastic bags are made of a range of lower-value plastics which are difficult to sort and re-process, they can contaminate other materials and become entangled in the sorting machinery.

Re-use your carrier bags or take them to a supermarket that has a recycling collection for bags.

Many supermarkets will also take a wide range of soft plastics for recycling such as ready meal lids, bread bags and fruit and vegetable bags.

A: If you don't generate a lot of waste and would prefer smaller bins we can discuss options with you. Phone 01259 450000 for details.
