



Community update – 9 June 2026

We know this has been a difficult and worrying time for residents and families. We are working closely with Clackmannanshire Council, Police Scotland, Scottish Fire and Rescue Service and other partners to keep people safe and share updates as our investigations continue. We want to continue to keep you updated on the work taking place and what it means for the community.

Site activity and safety

Work is continuing across the site, with specialist teams and contractors in place to support the ongoing response. This activity is being carefully managed alongside site security and traffic controls to help keep the area safe. We understand that some residents may need access to their homes for essential belongings, and we are continuing to support access during agreed time slots wherever it is safe to do so. Monitoring and investigations

We are continuing to monitor the ground closely and carry out further surveys and investigations to build a clearer picture of what is happening beneath the surface. We have installed monitoring points at Benbuck View, Dunmoss View and along The Glen. The data collected from the monitoring points helps us understand trends and ensures where movement is still occurring or slowing down.

This week we have been drilling several boreholes across the site at Benbuck View and our technical partners are working together to build a clearer picture of what is happening beneath the surface. This includes developing a detailed ground model and carrying out specialist geological and hydrogeological assessments.
