Subject: Public Convenience Provision in Alloa Town Centre

1.0 Purpose

1.1. The purpose of this report is to update Council on progress to date regarding the review of provision of public conveniences in Alloa town centre.

2.0 Recommendations

2.1. It is recommended that Council note consultation arrangements that will inform the review of provision of public conveniences in Alloa town centre in the context of other agreed developments.

3.0 Considerations

- 3.1. On 26 January 2012, the Council instructed officers not to proceed with the demolition of the toilet block at Maple Court in Alloa. In addition, officers were instructed to review the provision of public conveniences in Alloa town centre in the context of other agreed developments.
- 3.2. As part of the review process, a public consultation exercise is being undertaken between 20 February and 5 March 2012. The consultation takes the form of face to face interviews based on a structured questionnaire with shoppers, the local community and the business community. Interviews are being undertaken by council staff and volunteers from local community groups who assisted with gathering in views using the questionnaire.
- 3.3. The questionnaire has been made widely available online via Clacksweb and in paper form at council offices across the County.
- 3.4. The consultation has been publicised through various means, including posters in council offices, on Clacksweb and through social media such as Facebook, as well as through more traditional media, including local papers and radio coverage.
- 3.5. The questionnaire is based around 3 options, which respondents are asked to rank in order of preference:

	 Do Nothing - neither reinstate the public conveniences at Maple Court nor explore other options. 			
	Reinstate the previous public convenience provision at Maple Court;			
	 Temporarily reinstate the previous public convenience provision at Maple Court plus explore options for more modern public convenience provision in Alloa Town Centre, for example at the refurbished Speirs Centre. 			
3.6.	Following completion of the consultation exercise, the results will be analysed and will inform the review of the provision of public conveniences in Alloa town centre. A verbal update on the consultation exercise and findings will be given at the Council meeting on 8 March 2012.
