

These Regulations make provision in connection with premises licences under Part 3 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the Act"). The form of a premises licence and of a summary of such a licence are set by regulations 2 and 3 and Schedules 1 and 2. Regulation 4 and Schedules 3 and 4 set down the form of an application for a premises licence. In terms of section 20(2) of the Act, any application for a premises licence requires to be accompanied by a layout plan and an operating plan. Regulation 5 makes provision as to the layout plan and regulation 6 and Schedule 5 prescribe the form of an operating plan.

- 1. Having considered the content of the application I have the following comments to make, these comments should be treated as a representation in the terms of section 22 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005.
- 2. The application seeks to vary the premises licence No CC045 in the following ways:
 - a) To include an outdoor courtyard in the licensed area.
 - b) Change the terms of young persons access to the premises.
 - c) Amend the commencement hour on Sundays to allow alcohol sales from 11am.
 - d) Amend the operating plan to include a seasonal variations.
 - e) Add off sales of alcohol to the licence.
 - f) Other minor consequential changes to the operating plan
- 3. In relation to matters above I have no comment to make other than to highlight that these changes cause me no concern and simply bring the premises up to date with the licence holder's current business model and into line with other similar premises operating within Clackmannanshire.
- 4. The Premises Licence Holder both understands the additional responsibilities involved in the changes to the young persons access to the premises.
- 5. In relation to Item "a" above, the courtyard area has been an existing part of the premises for many years although is not part of the licensed area. I am unaware of any complaints made in relation to the courtyard and its use by customers of Bar Aldo.
- 6. The applicant is aware that recent amendments to the Statement of Licensing Policy, include a number licensing conditions that effect outdoor drinking areas, he has indicated that none of the proposed conditions would cause him any operating difficulty.

7. Having considered the context and likely levels of use of this particular outdoor area I would suggest that the conditions marked in bold and with an asterisk (*) in the list contained at appendix A to this report may be necessary and expedient for the purposes of securing compliance with the licensing objectives. However I have reproduced the full list of pool conditions from the 2018 Statement of Licensing Policy document and the Licensing Board may consider that additional condition as are necessary.

Appendix A – Extract from 2018 Statement of Licensing Policy

Premises with Outdoor Drinking Areas

The Board will require that in order to meet the licensing objectives under the Act that the applicant manages the outdoor drinking area in a responsible manner. Where the Board is minded to grant the application, some or all of the following conditions may apply to the licence:

- * Consumption of alcohol in the outdoor drinking is not permitted after 10.00pm. (other times may be agreed in appropriate circumstances)
- * No live or recorded music, live performances or other entertainment is permitted within the outdoor drinking area.
- * Customers using the outdoor drinking area shall at all times be supervised and/or monitored to ensure that nuisance or annoyance to neighbouring residents is not caused. In particular staff must take all reasonable steps to prevent shouting, singing and disorderly conduct within the outdoor area.

Customers consuming alcohol must not be permitted to not encroach on to the footpath or any adjoining public area outwith the boundaries of the licensed outdoor drinking area.

- * Where the outdoor drinking facility is to be used during the hours of darkness, the licence holder shall ensure that suitable lighting is provided for the convenience and safety of all persons on the premises.
- * The outdoor drinking facility must not be used for any purpose which is likely to cause annoyance to neighbours through smell, for example, the use of barbecues.
- * Any facility provided for the comfort of patrons such as outdoor heaters must be used and maintained in a safe manner and in accordance with manufacturers' instructions and any other statutory requirements.

The licence holder should insofar as practical provide plastic or other suitable non-glass drinking containers for use in the outdoor drinking area(s). The licence holder should seek to take all necessary steps to prevent customers taking glasses and in particular glass bottles into the outdoor drinking area.

- * Where smoking is permitted in the outdoor drinking area, ashtrays or other suitable receptacles will be provided.
- * Where smoking is permitted in the outdoor drinking area or in part of the outdoor area children and young persons will not be permitted access to the outdoor area or to any part of the area where smoking is permitted, or to any part of the outdoor area where second hand smoke may be present.

The Premises Licence Holder must prepare a document for the benefit of the current Premises Manager and any staff working on the premises, explaining how compliance with the conditions of the premises licence, insofar as they relate to the licensed outdoor drinking area, will be achieved and supervised. This document must be available to staff at all times and a record

should be kept of all staff trained in relation to it. This Document must also be available on the premises for inspection by the Licensing Standards Officer


In any outdoor drinking area attached to the premises the licence holder will be required to display such notices as prescribed by the Licensing Board. Notices prescribed in relation to this conditions may relate to such matters as

Noise
Conduct of Customers
Children's and Young Person's Access to the Area
Permitted hours of use

Outdoor drinking areas which are adjacent to a public place or public footpath, must at all times when the area is in use be clearly delineated by a physical barrier making the extent of the licensed area clear and obvious to any person using the area or using the adjacent public place or footpath.

* All alcohol to be consumed in the Outside Drinking Area must be taken to and from the Area by the designated premises manager or another member of staff authorised to serve or sell alcohol on their behalf. Patrons of the Premises are specifically prohibited from taking alcohol to or from the Premises to the Outside Drinking Area.

Only Plastic Polycarbonate or other unbreakable drinking vessels may be used in the outdoor drinking area. All drinks whether alcoholic or not must be decanted from any glass containers into unbreakable drinking vessels.

Police Scotland Licensing Overview

The Violence Prevention and Licensing Co-ordination Unit (VPLCU) sits within Safer Communities based at Dalmarnock Police Station, Glasgow.

The VPLCU upholds the two tier structure for licensing which supports both national and local priorities through service delivery. They have overall responsibility for determining and delivering national licensing strategy and policy, by providing advice, guidance and support to divisional licensing teams as well as undertaking other specialist functions.

The Violence Prevention and Licensing Co-ordination Unit is a specialist department which consists of a small team of officers, based in Glasgow. The officers within the unit work with divisional licensing teams and partner agencies to help shape policy and strategy around the police licensing function. They provide practical and tactical advice to police licensing practitioners, operational officers, supervisors and policing commanders.

The VPLCU seek to ensure that legislation governing the sale and supply of alcohol is applied consistently across the country and all opportunities are taken to stop the illegal or irresponsible sale, supply or consumption of alcohol with the intention of preventing and reducing crime and disorder.

During 2020/2021, from a licensing perspective, our particular focus will be on the following;

- Scrutiny of the serious incidents of violence, disorder and antisocial behaviour linked to licensed premises
- Continuous professional development training and guidance for staff to harmonise licensing practice across the country
- Working closely with statutory partners within a National Licensing Trade Forum to identify licensing related issues and prevent/reduce associated crimes
- Governance and ongoing development of the National ICT Licensing System, known as "Inn Keeper", to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of liquor and civic licensing administration and management
- The implementation and ongoing development of the Licensing Admin tool
 provides divisional licensing officers with a single ICT product negating the
 need to research police systems independently. Through accurate recording,
 the licensing admin tool assists Police Scotland in deploying our resources to
 the right places and the right time to keep people safe

Each of the 13 Local Policing Divisions have a licensing team responsible for the day to day management of licensing administration, complying with statutory requirements as well as addressing any issues that may arise within licensed premises in their local area.

Licensing Board Area

The Clackmannanshire local authority area is policed by Forth Valley Division.

Chief Superintendent Alan Gibson is the Local Police Commander who has the responsibility for all day-to-day policing functions. Chief Superintendent Gibson took over this role from Chief Superintendent Thom McLoughlin in December 2019.

The senior officers who hold responsibility for licensing within the area of Clackmannanshire are as follows;

Local Area Commander; Chief Inspector Audrey Marsh

Superintendent (Partnerships); Superintendent Mandy Paterson

Inspector, Preventions and Interventions; Inspector Vincent Hughes

Licensing Sergeant; Sergeant Liam Livingston

The Clackmannanshire Area Command serves over 51000 local residents over an area covering 61 square miles incorporating both urban and village communities. The Sub- Divisional Headquarters are based in Alloa.

There are a total of 135 licensed premises located throughout the Clackmannanshire Area Command. The highest concentration of premises are within Alloa Town Centre which has two nightclubs and numerous bars.

Local Policing Priorities

Following our public consultation process, the policing priorities for Forth Valley Division, as set out in our Local Policing Plan are as follows

- · Responsive to the concerns of our communities
- Enhancing our collective resilience to emerging threats
- Protecting people most at risk from harm
- Promoting confidence through our actions

Police Officers who work locally within Clackmannanshire Area Command and officers from the Police Licensing Department always have these priorities in mind during engagement with licensed premises staff and members of the community who are potentially affected by the operation of licensed premises within their community.

Operation of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

It is a fact that the misuse of alcohol can be harmful and damaging to our communities. In terms of policing, alcohol is very often a contributory factor in the calls that police officers attend from low level anti-social behaviour to domestic abuse and incidents of serious violence and injury.

To put this in perspective, in the year under report there were 757 cases of violent crime recorded within the Clackmannanshire Area, 224 (36.2%) of the offenders were drunk or under the influence of alcohol.

There were 578 cases of disorder reported and in 246 (47.3%) of these cases the accused were described as drunk or under the influence of alcohol.

In terms of offences linked directly with licensed premises there were a total of 23 cases of violent crime with the accused in 14 (66.7%) of these having been observed as drunk or had been drinking.

There were 13 disorder charges linked with licensed premises with the accused in 11 (73.3%) of those being either drunk or had been drinking.

Please note there may be more than one accused per charge which results in above percentages.

When considering these statistics it is important to bear in mind that within the total number of offences involving violent crime and disorder recorded during the year there were 338 charges recorded where the sobriety of the accused was not known. This would be the case when perhaps the accused was not immediately traced by police. Therefore it is a possibility that percentages of those drunk when committing offences could be higher.

The specific crime types are detailed in the statistics attached in Appendix A which show common assault and threatening abusive behaviour as by far the most common charges. Although not recorded as officially linked to licensed premises those involved in other crimes will have purchased their alcohol from a licensed premises somewhere along the line, whether this has been sold responsibly or otherwise.

It is the responsibility of Police Scotland to ensure that staff in licensed premises are complying with the Licensing Objectives as detailed in the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 and to take the necessary action when it is established that this is not the case. It is also the Police responsibility to ensure that those conducting themselves improperly on licensed premises are reported to the Procurator Fiscal and brought to justice.

In the Clackmannanshire Area Command this is achieved by the following means;

1. Weekend Policing Plan

Throughout the year the policing of licensed premises in Clackmannanshire is managed by the Weekend Policing Plan which is adapted weekly to take into account intelligence and recent incidents within licensed premises. The Divisional Alcohol and Violence Reduction Unit and Community Policing Teams staff this plan and conduct default patrols in Alloa town centre and around known hotspots as part of the plan. The focus of this is prevention and positive engagement rather than purely enforcement.

The Licensing Department review data from police systems on a daily basis and prepare a weekly report detailing all incidents within or connected to licensed premises throughout Clackmannanshire Area Command. This includes police reports, all telephone calls made or emails sent to police in relation to licensed premises and any intelligence received. The report also includes any significant events which are taking place and details of occasional licences and extended hours granted to licensed premises. This information is shared weekly when the Licensing Department meet with the Area Commander.

If patterns are identified within a licensed premises which give cause for concern then the premises become a monitored premises and will be inspected on a more frequent basis by local officers. All information in relation to these visits is fed back to the licensing department which considers any further action required.

If a premises is monitored the additional visits also provide support for the premises staff and any anti-social behaviour on the premises is dealt with robustly by the police officers in attendance. As can be seen from the attached statistics there have been very few offences relating to the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 within licensed premises although as previously stated there have been 23 charges involving violence and 13 disorder charges linked with licensed premises during the period under report.

It is worth noting that there were also 7 charges in relation to persons consuming alcohol in a public place. These charges are generally as a result of proactive work on the part of the police to prevent this type of anti-social behaviour on the streets. Of note, the number of such offences in Clackmannanshire has been in single figures for at least four years now.

There are also a significant amount of proactive inspections of Licensed Premises conducted to ensure compliance with the legislation and the Licensing Objectives.

During the period under report there were 536 proactive visits to licensed premises throughout Clackmannanshire Area Command which is a 28.5% rise on the 2018-2019 financial year. This includes inspections of town centre premises but also a significant amount of visits to premises based in less urban areas. Many of these visits have taken place at peak times both in the late evenings and during high profile football matches or other significant occasions.

Of note, towards the end of the financial year the Coronavirus pandemic resulted in the closure of all on-sales premises. The "lockdown" took effect on 23rd March 2020, therefore only nine days of the "lockdown" fell into the period under report and as such this is not assessed to have had a significant impact on the statistics which have been presented.

2. Monitored / intervention

Generally if an incident occurs at a licensed premises contact is made with those in a position of responsibility, the incident discussed and any necessary actions taken. In the majority of cases this prevents any repeat of the type of incident.

As mentioned in the previous section, if a premises gives cause for concern then it becomes a 'monitored' premises. This involves local officers and officers from the licensing department engaging with staff in an attempt to identify why there may have been repeated incidents occurring on the premises and offering the necessary advice and support.

If there is no change, then officers from the licensing department meet with the Designated Premises Manager and in some cases the Premises Licence Holder and prepare an Intervention plan which the police and the DPM/Licence holder sign. This involves agreed measures which will be taken to improve the operation of the premises; for example more staff-undergoing the training to become a personal licence holder, a change in the hours stewards are employed or more frequent toilet checks. The plans which are put in place are dependent on the problems being encountered.

Should the staff on the premises prove uncooperative and the problems continue then consideration would be given to submitting an application for review of the premises licence under Section 36 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 or a review of the personal licence of staff involved under Section 84A of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

I am pleased to report that during the period under report there was no requirement to class any premises in Clackmannanshire as monitored premises. One premises was being considered at the time of the Coronavirus outbreak and will form part of our next annual report. Consequently, no premises were subject to an intervention agreement and there were no premises licence review applications to the licensing board during the period under report.

Police Scotland did submit one report to the Licensing Board regarding an applicant for a personal licence. The Board subsequently refused the application.

The lack of enforcement action which has been necessary would indicate that the proactive work undertaken has been effective as a preventative measure.

Partnership Working

During 2019/2020 there has been a range of initiatives between Police and partner organisations aimed at ensuring safety in and around licensed premises. Generally, these partnership approaches focus on preventing issues from arising and identifying emerging issues early so that these can be resolved prior to enforcement action being necessary.

Having identified increases in calls to police on dates of Old Firm football fixtures proactive initiatives were carried out on the dates of all Old Firm games during the

period under report. Amongst other activities, this involved advance correspondence with licensed premises, preventative visits and high visibility patrols in and around licensed premises, reminding staff of their responsibilities and encouraging early engagement with police in the event of any incidents.

The licensing department were also in regular contact with SIA officers in relation to the conduct of stewards on the doors of premises ensuring a collaborative approach to any improper conduct by licensed stewards. During 2019 / 2020 no enforcement action by police was necessary in relation to stewards in the Clackmannanshire area.

Similarly, the Licensing Department maintained close links with Immigration Enforcement to ensure persons were not being employed on premises who had no permission to work in the United Kingdom. No-one was found to be involved in the sale of alcohol who did not have permission to work in the UK.

Police Officers from the Licensing Department as well as local officers worked well in partnership with the Licensing Standards Officer to identify and address any emerging issues before they became problematic. Of note, the Licensing Standards Officer reported an alleged fraud to police further to uncovering anomalies in the nomination of a Designated Premises Manager for one premises in Clackmannanshire and this incident is subject to an on-going investigation as are enquiries into further potential offences resulting from these anomalies. Due to the subject of the investigation no longer holding any licences in Clackmannanshire this matter will not result in a report to the Licensing Board.

Additional initiatives have taken place throughout the year to support licensed premises. This has included Operation Christmas where advance contact was made by community officers with the management of licensed premises to ascertain what party night / functions were being planned to ensure appropriate policing could be put in place. Resource levels were planned accordingly and at key times over the festive period more frequent visits to on-sales premises were made to provide reassurance to staff and customers.

In addition, in support of the 16 Days of Action on Domestic Abuse campaign, police, Alloa First and Licensed Premises worked together to promote awareness of the "Ask for Angela" sexual violence initiative which is aimed at keeping women safe whilst on dates. The initiative provides women with a means of alerting bar staff if they are concerned for their safety without putting themselves at risk.

Similarly, officers worked with partners in both on and off-sales outlets as part of a national initiative to promote awareness of the crime of robbery and how they can assist police in preventing such crimes and contribute to efforts to tackle offenders. This involved a leaflet campaign as well as advice being provided by police officers.

It would appear that there is general compliance with the law among licensed premises in the Clackmannanshire Area. These initiatives with partner agencies will continue as they have proved to be an effective deterrent. Furthermore, regular contact between the police and these partners assists with the flow of information and ensures that any emerging issues can be dealt with effectively.

It should be noted that the management and staff of licensed premises are also assessed to be partners in our efforts to combat alcohol related crime and disorder. By developing good working relations with those in the trade, local officers have been able to develop community intelligence assisting in detecting outstanding offences and disrupting those who involve themselves in serious criminality.

4. Licensing Policy Statement

Having been involved in 2018 in the development of the Clackmannanshire Licensing Board Statement of Licensing Policy 2018 – 2023, Police Scotland continued to take the Board's policy statement into account when assessing applications for licences and during discussions within the Licensing Forum. The Statement of Policy assists officers in understanding the expectations of the Board and ensuring that their actions are consistent with the aims and objectives of the Board.

5. Exclusion Orders / Closure Orders

Where a person is being reported to the Procurator Fiscal for an offence involving violence on a Licensed Premises the Police can request that consideration is given to imposing an exclusion order if a person is convicted. Section 94 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 gives the court the power to impose an exclusion order preventing the convicted person from entering certain licensed premises for a specified period of time. Police Scotland made 15 requests for Exclusion Orders over the relevant 12 month period. Police Scotland do not however hold information as to how many of these were imposed by the courts and it should be noted that there is often a delay of several months between the time of the police report being submitted and a person being convicted of the alleged offence.

Under section 97 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act police can apply to the Licensing Board for a closure order in relation to any premises as a result of a risk of disorder and risk to public safety. Provision also exists for a Constable of or above the rank of Inspector to make an emergency closure order in certain circumstances. During 2019/2020 there has been no necessity to apply for a closure order nor implement an emergency closure order in the Clackmannanshire area.

6. Licensing Forum

A representative from the Police Licensing Department regularly attends the local licensing forum in order to hear from licence holders and members of the public and address any concerns they may have. This also contributes to an effective working relationship with licensed premises staff and ultimately a safer environment for the people of Clackmannanshire.

7. Applications For Licences

Section 22 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 covers applications for a premises licence. All applications for premises licences are considered by police. This is achieved by scrutinising police databases to ensure that the granting of a licence will not present issues for the community. Police Officers from the Licensing Department will also make contact with local police officers to ascertain if they predict any problems with the granting of the licence and on most occasions will make contact with the prospective licence holder and visit the proposed premises in order to gain an understanding of what the licence holder is looking to achieve.

There have been no objections to premises licence applications during 2019 / 2020.

Section 72 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 covers applications for a personal licence. All applications for personal licences are considered by police by carrying out checks on police databases. In the year 2019 / 2020 there was one objection to the grant of a personal licence.

8. Other Licensing Offences

It is worth noting that there are has been no-one reported to the Procurator Fiscal for offences under Section 1 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 (selling alcohol without a licence) or Section 63 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 (selling alcohol out with licensed hours) in the Clackmannanshire area during the 2019 / 2020 period although there is an on-going investigation arising from the report referred to earlier from the Licensing Standards Officer. Likewise there have been no charges for offences such as selling alcohol to a drunk person or staff being drunk on licensed premises.

It can be concluded that through effective analysis of information and strong partnership working underpinned by our local policing priorities Licensed Premises in Clackmannanshire operate for the most part effectively and safely and in support of the Licensing Objectives laid out in the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

Preventing the sale or supply of alcohol to children or young persons

It is recognised that alcohol misuse among children and young persons can be extremely damaging and may result in antisocial behaviour and a negative impact on the community as well as the children involved.

As can be seen from the attached statistics there is one charge relating to buying or attempting to buy alcohol for a child which relates to a person purchasing alcohol from an off-sales premises and giving it to a child. There have been no charges in relation to selling alcohol to a child or young person or any charges in relation to young person's buying or attempting to buy alcohol.

Community Police Officers in Clackmannanshire engage directly with children, educating them as to the potential dangers involved in consuming alcohol. They have the trust of children and young persons in the local community and can gather

intelligence in relation to their alcohol consumption and take any appropriate action. The Preventions and Interventions Department at Forth Valley also engage with young people throughout the community and deliver presentations aimed to raise awareness of potential risks.

Police officers on day to day duties who come across children and young persons under the influence of alcohol share this information with partner organisations such as healthcare, social work and education and steps can be taken to attempt to establish the root cause for these behaviours rather than criminalising these children.

As can be seen from the attached statistics the percentage of criminal activity in and around licensed premises involving children is negligible.

Tackling Serious and Organised Crime

Licensed Premises are one type of business known to be used by Serious and Organised Crime Groups for the purposes of laundering money and the commission of drugs offences. Clackmannanshire Area Command fully engages with Scotland's Serious and Organised Crime Strategy aiming to Divert, Deter, Detect and Disrupt serious and organised crime and the harm it causes. Serious and Organised Crime is not just about drugs but is linked to Human Trafficking, Cyber Crime and Sexual Exploitation.

On a local basis in relation to licensed premises the Community Policing Teams and Licensing Department regularly engage with the local community and staff within licensed premises ensuring that there is a comprehensive intelligence picture in relation to potential Serious and Organised Criminal Activity within licensed premises in the area. The Licensing Department is regularly in contact with the Force Disruptions Unit, sharing information and working to deny persons involved in this type of activity access to licensed premises.

Statistical Analysis

Statistical data regarding crime levels has been included in Appendix A to this report in order to assist Board members' understanding of the levels of crime relating to licensed premises over the period of the report. This also provides a comparison with previous years in order to provide a better understanding of any trends or changes in levels in relation to a particular crime type.

Proposed activity

The early part of the forthcoming year will no doubt see considerable disruption to licensed premises due to the Coronavirus pandemic and the associated lockdown. It is acknowledged that this will present challenging times for many licence holders and staff of licensed premises. Whilst recognising this, Police Scotland will take measures to ensure that licensed premises are not used in a manner that may facilitate the spread of coronavirus nor contribute to alcohol related harm. In doing so the Force

policy of Engagement, Encouragement, Explanation and Enforcement, with the last being as a last resort will be followed.

Police will continue to work alongside partners locally including the Licensing Standards Officer, HMRC and Trading Standards to ensure that off-sales, and when they re-open to the public, on-sales premises, are safe places to frequent and to socialise.

It is likely that the effects of the pandemic will have a longer term impact on the licensed trade as economic pressures lead to closures, changes of ownership and new business ventures. As new challenges are presented, Police Scotland will seek to adapt and respond in a reasonable and proportionate manner to ensure that the licensing objectives are at the heart of our joint efforts in relation to licensed premises.

Intelligence led policing of licensed premises will continue, responding to the concerns of our communities and taking enforcement action when necessary.

To conclude we would like to thank you for your continued support and stress the importance of this collaborative, problem solving approach. It is through this approach that we will achieve our purpose of improving the safety and wellbeing of people, places and communities in Scotland.

Violence and Disorder Offences - All Locus Types

Table 1 shows a summary of the total number of Violent Crime and Disorder offences in the Clackmannanshire area over a three year period. The data shows the percentage of accused persons who were recorded as 'being drunk' or 'had been drinking' at the time of the offence. (note: Along with the number of detected charges, the number of accused persons is provided in brackets. These two figures can differ due to multiple accused per charge on occasions.)

- Violent Crime data for the most recent period 2019/20 showed a similar level of charges to 2017/18 with 2018/19 having experienced a lower level in the total number of charges during the three year period.
 - The percentage of violent offenders who were intoxicated was at its highest during the most recent period 2019/20, increasing from 30.3% in 2018/19 to 36.3%.
 - Disorder data provided that the number of disorder type charges increased from the period 2018/19 into the most recent period as did the number of accused persons recorded as 'drunk' or 'had been drinking'
- Looking at the total number of violent crime and disorder charges and accused persons under the influence of alcohol, the increase from the previous period can be attributed mainly to violent crime.

Charges of common assault and threatening or abusive behaviour account for the majority of offences, together making up over 85% of charges in each period.

2018/19 saw lower levels of most offences including common assault and threatening or abusive behaviour.

The detection rate for serious assaults has shown a decreasing trend over the three year period.

Violent and disorder type offences recorded as occurring in licensed premises accounted for, on average, 2.5% of the offences for all locus types. The data will not include any offences that may be linked to licenced premises which occurred just outside the locus and have been recorded as locus sub type 'street' for example.

- Total charges for the most recent period 2019/20 increased from the lower level seen in 2018/19.
- The detection rate fluctuated over the three year period although did increase from the lower level seen in 2018/19. It should be noted that the detection rate will have had an impact on accused sobriety data for any given period.
- The percentage of accused being under the influence of alcohol is consistently high across the periods.

1.0 Purpose

1.1 The purpose of this report is to enable the Licensing Board to consider its approach to the festive period 2020-21.

2.0 Background

2.1 For a number of years the Board has agreed a general permitted extension to licensing hours over the festive period. This approach has been well received by the licensed trade.

3.0 Recommendation

- 3.1 It is recommended that the Board:
 - 3.1.1 Note that the Statement of Licencing Policy has incorporated the Festive Policy
 - 3.1.2 Agree that any general extension incorporated into the Statement of Licensing Policy 2018 shall apply for the period of 11 December 2020 to 2 January 2021 subject to any national restrictions imposed as a result of Covid-19.

4.0 Consideration

4.1 For 6 years the Board has granted a General Extension of licensed hours for the Festive Period. This approach has now been incorporated into the current consultation on the Statement of Licensing Policy.

The Statement of Licensing Policy "Festive Policy" considers it appropriate to grant a general extension of one additional hour to the terminal hour on all On Sales premises, unless that would extend trading beyond 2 am. An additional special provision to allow a 2am terminal hour where Christmas Eve and New Years Eve fall on a day other then a Friday and Saturday. This has been the same approach taken by the Board in previous years. As indicated above, to date this policy has been well supported, by the Police and the trade in

particular. The Statement does indicate that the dates that the festive policy will apply will continue to be set at this meeting in the cycle by the Board. Therefore it has been considered appropriate at this point to make a recommendation on when any agreed festive policy would apply.

This year there is a high degree of uncertainty in relation to the On Sales trade as a result of the impact of Covid-19. Any decision of the Board in relation to festive opening hours will be subject to any national restrictions on opening.

4.2 The administration of extended hours applications can be time consuming for the licensing team, as the Licensing Standards Officer is required to submit a report on each application, even if there are no concerns regarding the extension in question. As a result of this requirement, applications for extended hours cannot be determined under delegated powers, and require Board Members to approve each application. The fee payable for this is £10 and does not cover the cost of processing the application. Separately, this imposes a regulatory burden on licensed premises.

- 5.2. As reported previously to the Board the potential reduction in the number of extended hours applications will result in continued reduced income. However the cost of processing an application far exceeds the statutory fee and the loss of income is offset by the overall benefits gained by the Board, Council and applicants as detailed in this report.

5.3. Staffing

The grant of a general extension would remove the requirement for licence holders to submit an extended hours application. This would reduce the administrative burden on the licensing service, and would not require the Board to determine applications subject to a LSO report at short notice and prior to the Festive Break.



Section 57(1)(b) of The Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005 (the Act) requires that the Licensing Board notifies the Licensing Standards Officer for the area in relation to any application for an occasional licence. This section further provides that the Licensing Standards Officer is provided with a copy of the application.

Having considered the content of the applications to which this representation relates, I have the following comments to make:

- 1. This representation relates to 3 occasional licences each lasting for a period of 14 days, and seeking authority to make sales of alcohol for on sales consumption in an outdoors space which is not currently part of the licensed footprint of the premises at the above address.
- 2. The 3 applications seek to licence the premises from 23 October 2020 for a continuous period of 6 weeks until 3 December 2020.
- The purpose of an occasional licence is to allow premises that are not normally licensed to be licensed "occasionally". Not necessarily for a special event or special occasion.
- 4. If these applications are granted it will result in continuous licensed period of 18 weeks in relation to this area. The applicant is aware that they should be looking to a more permanent licensing solution if they wish to continue the use of this area in the longer term.
- 5. I should point out to the Licensing Board that from 1st October (selected only as an indicative date) the sunset time is 18:48hrs reducing by 2-3 minutes each day

- thereafter. Ultimately darkness will fall at around 16:20hrs on 8th November, 2020.
- 6. There is however adequate street lighting in the area.
- 7. On Friday 3 July 2020, the Licensing Board approved the use of a pre-application guidance document for those wishing to licence a new outdoor area. The applicant in this case has had the opportunity to view the document, has completed the supplementary information form and has acknowledged the understanding statement. The applicant has accepted the suggested conditions in that document and fully understands that additional conditions, from the pool list contained in the statement of licensing policy, may also be applied as local conditions.
- 8. Although the applicant has failed to adequately identify and describe the area to be licensed on the application form, I have proceeded on the assumption that their intention is to licence the area that is part of the footpath (as shown on the attached drawing) in Drysdale Street, Alloa. This area is owned by Clackmannanshire Council.
- 9. The area is suitable for licensing in the current circumstances.
- 10. The applicant is aware that they should only use personal licence holders or other staff trained to the standards required by the Licensing (Training of Staff)(Scotland) Regulations 2007 to sell alcohol at the premises.
- 11. The applicant has also been advised that any staff left in charge at the premises should be the holder of a personal licence or should be able to make immediate contact with a personal licence holder responsible for the management of the premises, during all licensed hours.
- 12. This application covers a area of footpath along the majority of the frontage of one of Alloa's largest licensed venues. There are a number of other licensed premises in the immediate vicinity, and it is fair to say that there have been incidents of anti social behaviour in the immediate vicinity of these premises.
- 13. The Board may want to consider weather or not it is necessary and expedient for the purposes of the licensing objectives to have this particular licensed premises supervised by a suitably licensed SIA Steward or Stewards working in conjunction with the staff appointed to the area. This may only be necessary at key busy periods and I would suggest from 6pm to Closure at 10pm on a Friday and Saturday when the outdoor area is in use maybe the key period when public nuisance, crime and disorder is most likely. If the Board is minded to apply such a local condition I have drafted a suggested local condition at the end of Appendix A (No. 8).
- 14. Appendix A contains a list of suggested conditions that the Licensing Board may wish to impose on granting this application. These conditions are necessary to ensure compliance with the licensing objectives contained within The Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005.

- 1 Alcohol sold for consumption in the licensed outdoor area will be ordered from, and delivered to the table, by staff employed at the premises.
- 2 The outdoor area must be clearly separated from any neighbouring unlicensed area by a physical barrier such as a fence or series of posts and rope or tape of at least 1 metre in height.
- 3 The outside area can only be occupied by persons seated at a table.
- 4 The licence holder must ensure that alcohol is only consumed by persons seated at a table.






