

**Application for a Non Minor Variation- Modification of Operating Plan** 

Addition of Televised Sports within Core Hours

Bridge Street Bar, 18 Bridge Street, Dollar, FK14 7DE CC208

- 1. Having considered the content of the application I have the following comments to make, these comments should be treated as a representation in the terms of section 22 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005.
- 2. The application seeks to vary the premises licence No CC208 in the following ways:
  - a) To allow the viewing of Televised Sports on the Premises
- 3. I have no concerns about the specifics of variation sought, however the Board are asked to consider the content of paragraphs 4 20 prior to granting the application.
- 4. In late 2019 Bridge Street Bar was granted premises licence No CC208.
- 5. At the time of application the proposed nature of the premises was explained to the Licensing Board by the applicant as a wine/cocktail bar, with the primary purpose of offering a supporting business to the existing restaurant Bridge Street Kitchen.
- 6. Many of the existing local premises licence conditions were applied to the licence with that connection between the two premises in mind.
- 7. In 2020 the business virtually ceased trading as a direct result of the business interruption caused to the licence trade by the SARS CoV-2 pandemic.
- 8. In 2022, the Licence holder Andrew Mackie leased the premises to a new operator (Bruce Harper –also Premises Manager).
- 9. The business has been trading since the middle of 2022, however the general nature of the business has changed significantly.

- 10. It appears that there is no longer a close connection to the business of Bridge Street Kitchen, which is still currently closed.
- 11. The change in nature of the business has attracted a younger and lively crowd of new customers.
- 12. The premises now trades more like a traditional bar offering music and inadvertently for a period televised sport, despite this not being permitted by the existing Operating Plan.
- 13. The change in operating style of the premises has attracted a number of complaints from nearby residents.
- 14. The complaints centre on noise and customer behaviour related nuisance emanating from the change of use in the outdoor area to the front of the premises.
- 15. Although these complaints have now been addressed by the licence holder and premises manager, and have resulted in changes to the way the premises operates the business in particular the outdoor area
- 16. In 2019, Local conditions were applied to the premises licence in relation to the use of the outdoor area, however these conditions may now be considered to be outdated as a result both the change of nature of the business and the creation of "pool" of the conditions listed in the Clackmannanshire Licensing Board, Statement of Licensing Policy.
- 17. This variation application creates an opportunity to modify these conditions to meet the requirements of the current business operation.
- 18. I would suggest that all of the current local conditions are removed from the licence and replaced with the list of proposed conditions contained at appendix A.
- 19. The Licensing Board of course must be satisfied that those suggested conditions are necessary and expedient for the purposes of the licensing objectives.
- 20. In addition to conditions listed in appendix A the Licensing Board may consider it necessary and expedient to add further local conditions from the list of pool conditions contained in the current statement of licensing Policy. That list is reproduced in full at appendix B

### **Appendix A**

### **Suggested Local Conditions**

- In the approved outdoor area the number of patrons using this area may not exceed the number of seated places available for customers.
- In the approved outdoor area alcohol may only be consumed by persons seated at tables in that area.
- Consumptions of alcohol in the outdoor drinking is not permitted after 10.00pm
- All furniture associated with the use of the outdoor area must be cleared from the area by no later than 10:00pm
- No live or recorded music, live performances or other entertainment is permitted within the outdoor drinking area.
- Live or recorded music or televised events on the premises must not be visible or audible within the outdoor area
- Customers using the outdoor drinking area shall at all times be supervised and/or monitored
  to ensure that nuisance or annoyance to neighbouring residents is not caused. In particular
  staff must take all reasonable steps to prevent shouting, singing and disorderly conduct
  within the outdoor area.
- Customers consuming alcohol must not be permitted to not encroach on to the footpath or any adjoining public area outwith the boundaries or the licensed outdoor drinking area.
- Where the outdoor drinking facility is to be used during the hours or darkness, the licence holder shall ensure that suitable lighting is provided for the convenience and safety of all persons on the premises.
- The outdoor drinking facility must not be used for any purpose which is likely to cause annoyance to neighbours through smell, for example, the use of barbecues, but including vaping or smoking tobacco or other products
- The Premises Licence Holder must prepare a document for the benefit of the current Premises Manager and any staff working on the premises, explaining how compliance with the conditions of the premises licence, insofar as they relate to the licenced outdoor drinking area, will be achieved and supervised. This document must be available to staff at all times and a record should be kept of all staff trained in relation to it. This Document must also be available on the premises for inspection by the Licensing Standards Officer.
- In any outdoor drinking area attached to the premises the licence holder will be required to display such notices as prescribed by the Licensing Board. Notices prescribed in relation to these conditions may relate to such matters as
  - o Noise
  - o Conduct of Customers
  - o Children's and Young Person's Access to the Area
  - o Permitted hours of use

- Outdoor drinking areas which are adjacent to a public place or public footpath, must at all
  times when the area is in use be clearly delineated by a physical barrier making the extent of
  the licenced area clear and obvious to any person using the area or using the adjacent
  public place or footpath.
- All alcohol to be consumed in the Outside Drinking Area must be taken to and from the Area
  by the designated premises manager or another member of staff authorised to serve to sell
  alcohol on their behalf. Patrons of the Premises are specifically prohibited from taking
  alcohol to or from the Premises to the Outside Drinking Area.
- Children and you persons are only permitted to use the outdoor area when accompanied by an adult over the age of 18 years of age who is a parent or other relative or person responsible for their guardianship.
- Only alcohol that has been sold on the premises can be consumed in the outdoor areas.

### Appendix B

### **Extract from 2018 Statement of Licensing Policy**

### **Premises with Outdoor Drinking Areas**

The Board will require that in order to meet the licensing objectives under the Act that the applicant manages the outdoor drinking area in a responsible manner. Where the Board is minded to grant the application, some or all of the following conditions may apply to the licence:

Consumption of alcohol in the outdoor drinking areas is not permitted after 10.00pm.

No live or recorded music, live performances or other entertainment is permitted within the outdoor drinking areas.

Customers using the outdoor drinking areas shall at all times be supervised and/or monitored to ensure that nuisance or annoyance to neighbouring residents is not caused. In particular staff must take all reasonable steps to prevent shouting, singing and disorderly conduct within the outdoor area.

Customers consuming alcohol must not be permitted to not encroach on to the footpath or any adjoining public area outwith the boundaries of the licensed outdoor drinking area.

Where the outdoor drinking facility is to be used during the hours of darkness, the licence holder shall ensure that suitable lighting is provided for the convenience and safety of all persons on the premises.

The outdoor drinking facility must not be used for any purpose which is likely to cause annoyance to neighbours through smell, for example, the use of barbecues.

Any facility provided for the comfort of patrons such as outdoor heaters must be used and maintained in a safe manner and in accordance with manufacturers' instructions and any other statutory requirements.

The licence holder should insofar as practical provide plastic or other suitable non-glass drinking containers for use in the outdoor drinking area(s). The licence holder should seek to take all necessary steps to prevent customers taking glasses and glass bottles into the outdoor drinking area.

Where smoking is permitted in the outdoor drinking area, ashtrays or other suitable receptacles will be provided.

Where smoking is permitted in the outdoor drinking area or in part of the outdoor area children and young persons will not be permitted access to the outdoor area or to any part of

the area where smoking is permitted, or to any part of the outdoor area where second hand smoke may be present.

The Premises Licence Holder must prepare a document for the benefit of the ..(current Office Bearers/committee members/staff working on the premises\*).., explaining how compliance with the conditions of the premises licence, insofar as they relate to the licensed outdoor drinking area, will be achieved and supervised. This document must be available to staff at all times and a record should be kept of all staff trained in relation to it. This Document must also be available on the premises for inspection by the Licensing Standards Officer.

In any outdoor drinking area attached to the premises the licence holder will be required to display such notices as prescribed by the Licensing Board. Notices prescribed in relation to this condition may relate to such matters as

Noise
Conduct of Customers
Children's and Young Person's Access to the Area
Permitted hours of use

Outdoor drinking areas which are adjacent to a public place, car park or public footpath, must at all times when the area is in use be clearly delineated by a physical barrier making the extent of the licensed area clear and obvious to any person using the area or using the adjacent public place or footpath.

All alcohol to be consumed in the Outside Drinking Area must be taken to and from the Area by the designated premises manager or another member of staff authorised to serve or sell alcohol on their behalf. Patrons of the Premises are specifically prohibited from taking alcohol to or from the Premises to the Outside Drinking Area.

Only Plastic Polycarbonate or other unbreakable drinking vessels may be used in the outdoor drinking area. All drinks whether alcoholic or not must be decanted from any glass containers into unbreakable drinking vessels.

Only alcohol that has been sold on the premises can be consumed in the outdoor areas.

### 1.0 Purpose

- 1.1 The Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 prescribes that all personal licence holders must undergo mandatory training in a form prescribed by the Scottish Ministers no later than 3 months following the period beginning 5 years from the date that the personal licence was issued.
- 1.2 The Board is therefore asked to take the following procedural steps to deal with the matters contained in this report.

### 2.0 Recommendation

2.1 That the Board makes a formal decision to revoke the personal licences set out in the table appended to this report in terms of section 87(3) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

### 3.0 Considerations

- 3.1 The 2005 Act prescribes that all personal licence holders must undertake refresher training and thereafter provide the Board with confirmation of the completed training within a period of 5 years and 3 months following the date of the issue of the licence. Where the licence holder fails to do so, the Board must revoke the licence.
- 3.2 The Board is required to notify all licence holders not less than 3 months before the expiry of the requirement to undertake and provide evidence of refresher training. The Board first wrote to affected licence holders in August 2020 subsequent reminders have been sent to remind them of this requirement. The Coronavirus (Scotland) Act 2020 amends the 2005 Act to allow for an extension of time where the failure to comply has been as a result of coronavirus. None of the licence holders listed in appendix one has indicated this is the case and it is understood that training has been available virtually.
- 3.3 The licence holders identified in the table at appendix 1 have failed to comply with the requirements under the 2005 Act. The Board must therefore revoke the licences.
