

- 1. This representation relates to an application for a new premises licence for Devonvale Hall, Moss Road Tillicoultry.
- 2. Devonvale Hall is a community Hall run by volunteers, with a capacity of around 420 seated individuals. It is often used as an event venue with a capacity of around 250 seated around tables.
- 3. I have no concerns with the terms of the application or the proposed operating plan.
- 4. I must however highlight that the operating plan seeks hours that are quite unusual for a venue of this nature.
- 5. The commencement hour of 1800hrs daily, seems to be unduly restrictive to any daytime use that the premises may seek in the future.
- 6. The terminal hour of 0100hrs 7 nights per week, is also slightly later (Sunday to Thursday) than the hours normally permitted for this type of venue.
- 7. In relation to the hours sought I have no concerns, due to the nature and location of the venue; I do not expect that a permanent licence will have a major impact on the licensing objectives.
- 8. The premises have successfully operated for many years without complaint using regular occasional licences to authorise the sale of alcohol at many events.
- 9. There is nothing contained within the application or operating plan that would cause me to seek additional local conditions on the licence.


