- 1. Having considered the content of the application I have the following comments to make, these comments should be treated as a representation in the terms of section 22 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005.
- 2. The application to be determined seeks to vary the premises licence No CC040 in accordance with the submitted application form.
- 3. A number of historical issues and ongoing discussions have resulted in the delay in submission of this report, I understand that the legal agent representing the applicant takes no issue with its late submission, and I would ask that the Licensing Board also accept the late submission of the representation.
- 4. In relation to the proposed changes I believe that the existing licensing objectives and mandatory license conditions will be adequate to manage the operation of the premises.
- 5. The licence holder/premises manager is well versed in the terms of the licensing objectives, and appears to fully understand his responsibilities in relation to the premises. He has previously provided assurances that he is responsible for the day to day management of the premises.
- 6. The only matter |I wish to highlight in relation to the proposed operating plan is in relation to the "Column 4 explanation box" in relation to Question 5 on the Operating Plan.
- 7. Q5 details the activities that could take place on the premises during and outwith core hours, and where activities are proposed outwith core hours there is a need to explain them further in a freetext box.

- 8. The freetext suggest that alcohol may be required to be served at certain events that could commence prior to the requested core hours.
- 9. I would highlight that although mentioned in the operating plan as "desirable", granting the operating plan in the terms applied for does not automatically allow for the sale of alcohol outwith core hour. Alcohol can only be sold outwith core hours where an extended hours application has been granted by the licensing Board in relation to a particular event or period.
- 10. This information would have to be clearly communicated to all staff working on the premises.
- 11. I have no further comments to make about this application.

- 1. Having considered the content of the application I have the following comments to make, these comments should be treated as a representation in the terms of section 22 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005.
- 2. The application to be determined seeks to vary the premises licence No CC006 in accordance with the submitted application form.
- 3. The variation seeks to include the home delivery of groceries including alcohol products in the list of additional activities at question 5(f)
- 4. The recently published statement of Licensing Policy 2023-2028 (the Policy) confirms at page 19 that the Board will require all premises seeking to make home deliveries of alcohol to have this specified on their operating plan.
- 5. The Policy goes on to indicate that home delivery of alcohol should be robustly managed and is likely to attract additional local conditions where the Licensing Board think it is necessary and expedient for the purposes of the licensing objectives.
- 6. In this case, I would suggest that to support compliance with the licensing objectives contained within the Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005, that if the Board decide to grant the variation they should apply additional local condition of the type suggested in the Policy.
- 7. At **Appendix A** I have drafted proposed conditions for the benefit of the Licensing Board, that I believe will adequately address the common concerns that surround the home delivery of alcohol.
- 8. Those concerns are deliveries being made to under age persons, or to persons who are drunk or at serious risk of harm from drinking alcohol, and deliveries being made by untrained individuals, or by couriers that do not have robust age verification measures in place.

9. I have discussed the possibility of conditions of the nature suggested with the applicants legal agent, and he has indicated that he would have taken instruction in relation to the proposals prior to the Board hearing.

Appendix A

Draft Local | Conditions Home Delivery Of Alcohol

- 1. A written Age Verification Policy (AVP) must be kept and applied to all sales of alcohol for delivery to any place off the premises. This AVP must set out the steps that are to be taken to establish the age of a person attempting to take delivery of alcohol ("the customer") if it appears to the person making delivery of the alcohol that the customer appears to be less than 25 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy).
- 2. Information must be provided to customers whether online or in store that Alcohol will only be left at the delivery address with a person who can prove that they are over 18 years of age.
- Premises Licence holders and Premises Managers must ensure that all persons involved in the delivery of alcohol from the premises have received appropriate training in the content and application of the Age Verification Policy to be applied to all deliveries.
- 4. A record of all persons trained in relation to the Age Verification Policy will be kept on the premises and made available to the Licensing Standards Officer and any Constable of Police Scotland.
- 5. A copy of the training record referred to in No 4 above should be supplied to delivery agent on completion of the training
- 6. Licence holders and Premises Managers will ensure that all persons involved in the delivery of alcohol from the premises have received appropriate training to ensure that deliveries of alcohol are not made to persons who are or appear to be drunk.
- 7. Licence holders using Royal Mail, a private postal service, a courier service or independent delivery drivers will ensure that an age verified signed for delivery option is utilised that requires any package containing alcohol to be left with an adult over 18 at the specified delivery address and at no other place.
- 8. The premises licence holder will ensure that records of all alcohol deliveries are retained on the premises and that those record contain the following information, the forename and surname of the purchaser, the delivery address, the quantity and type of alcohol delivered and the purchase price.

9. All records, electronic or written made in relation to the delivery of alcohol will be kept on the premises for at least 12 months and will be made available on demand to a Licensing Standards Officer for the area where the premises are located or to a Constable of Police Scotland.

Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005 Section 28(5), Premises Licence Holder Dissolved Weirs (Alloa) Social & Recreation Club CC137

- 1. Weirs (Alloa) Social & Recreation Club, 1 Church Street, Alloa, are the holders of premises Licence No CC137, granted by Clackmannanshire Licensing Board on 1 September, 2009.
- 2. In October, 2023, the Organisation that is known as Weirs (Alloa) Social & Recreation Club entered into a formal arrangement to dissolve the club.
- 3. The dissolution was recorded at a meeting of the club committee and, the then President Robert Rodger, has confirmed on this day 11 April, 2024 that this process took place.
- 4. The premises were put up for sale and have recently been sold to a developer.
- 5. The terms of Section 28 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act, 2005, have now been met in two parts - Part 5(b), the licensed premises in respect of which the licence was issued have ceased to be used for the sale of alcohol, and part 5(e) the premises licence holder, being a person other than an individual, a partnership or a company, has been dissolved.
- 6. The result is that the premises licence has ceased to have effect
- 7. This report asks that the Licence Board, note and confirm by declaration that premises Licence No CC137 is no longer in effect in accordance with the terms of Section 28(1)(b) of the Licensing Scotland Act, 2005.

1. Change of Name or Address

Section 88 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 requires that a personal licence holder must, no later than one month after any change in the licence holder's name or address give the Licensing Board which issues the licence notice of the change. It is an offence not to do so.

2. Licensing Qualifications

Licensing qualifications are dealt with in section 91 of Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005. In summary, to be eligible for a personal licence an applicant must be aged 18 or over and possess a licensing qualification, and no personal licence previously held by the applicant must have been revoked within the period of 5 years ending with the day on which the application was received by the Licensing Board.

3. Photographs

One of the photographs submitted with your application should be endorsed on the back. This endorsement should contain the words "I certify that this is a true likeness of "(name of applicant)", followed by the full name of the person endorsing the photograph.

4. Convictions

Section 75 of the Act places a duty on an applicant for a personal licence to notify the Licensing Board if he or she has been convicted of any relevant or foreign offence during the time between making the application and the application being determined by the Licensing Board. Furthermore, section 82 of the Act requires personal licence holders to notify their Licensing Board of any convictions for relevant or foreign offences within one month of the licence holder being convicted.
