- 7. Dealing with regulatory and enforcement issues arising from matters delegated to or delivered by Community and Regulatory Services related to Environmental Health, Licensing (other than alcohol licensing) and Trading Standards.
- 8. Taking decisions on suspending or altering a premises approval as provided for under the Marriage (Scotland) Act 2002.
- 9. Holding hearings for the purposes of paragraph 7 of Schedule1 of the Smoking Health and Social Care (Scotland) Act 2005 (the SHSCA 2005).
- 10. Hearing appeals against officers' decisions to refuse or remove a landlord's or agent's registration under part 8 of the Antisocial Behaviour etc (Scotland) Act 2004.

Report by: Regulatory Services Manager

1.0 Purpose

- 1.1. To present to the Regulatory Committee an application from Sterling Travel. To vary a condition for Private Hire Operator's licence PH38 from the exemption from Standard Condition 16(6) relating to the display of "Pre Booked Hire Only" door signs and private hire car vehicle plates.
- 1.2. The Licensing Authority has received a letter from the Council's Civic Licensing Standard's Officer (CLSO) therefore the Committee is asked to consider the application for the exemption from Licensing Standard Condition No 16(6)

2.0 Recommendations

2.1. That the Committee considers all of the information provided from all parties and determine the matter before them in accordance with the provisions of the 1982 Act.

3.0 Considerations

- 3.1. Under the terms of the 1982 Act the applicant has applied to vary the licensing condition relating the display of pre booked hire only door signs and private hire car vehicle plates. The applicant was originally granted a Private Hire Operators Licence under delegated powers for PH38 on 22 November 2016. The operator's licence has been renewed annually. A copy of the variation application is provided and marked as Appendix 1.
- 3.2. In accordance with the 1982 Act a copy of the application form was sent to relevant consultee for consultation. The CLSO has responded that the applicant has applied to vary the licence condition for PH38 to remove the condition for the requirement for pre booked hire door signage and the position of private hire plates. The applicant is also seeking approval of have advertising imagery in the form of lettering covering the entire surface of the interior to the rear facing window of the vehicle. The advertising proposed does not appear to be in line with exclusive, executive car hire use.

- 3.3. The purpose of the "pre booked hire only" door signs is to differentiate between private hire cars and taxis. The Committee has previously granted an exemption from this condition where the applicant has demonstrated the signs would be detrimental to the exclusive service they offered to clients..
- 3.4. The applicant has had discussions with the CLSO and has indicated that he still wants to continue on the School Transport Framework. The CLSO is in doubt that the applicant's business model and operation is consistent with exclusive executive hire. A school transport contract could not be described as executive hire. The requested advertising on the rear window of the vehicle also suggests the vehicle is used as a traditional private hire car.
- 3.5. Conditions relating to the exclusive use of the vehicle as chauffeur driven executive cars can be applied and examples are given at Appendix A to the CLSO's report. A copy of the letter from the Councils CLSO is provided and marked Appendix 2
- 3.6. The Regulatory Committee therefore asked to consider all the information before them and having done so to determine whether to (1) grant the variation to conditions or (2) to refuse the variation.

Civic Government (Scotland) Act, 1982
Application to Vary Private Hire Car Operator Licence
David Baird t/a Sterling Travel, PH38
Exemption from Licence Standard Conditions No 16(6)

- 1. This report relates to an application to vary a private hire car operators licence, made by David Baird, trading as Sterling Travel,
- 2. The application seeks to vary the Licence Standard Conditions attached to Private Hire Car Licence No PH38.
- 3. The licence relates to a Ford Tourneo 8 seater minibus, which has been licensed and operating as a Private Hire Car in Clackmannanshire since November 2016.
- 4. The vehicle is a 2016 model, and is currently licensed and subject to a safety inspection in accordance with the Clackmannanshire Council, Licence Standard Conditions.
- 5. The application seek, to have the Licence Standard Conditions varied to remove condition No 16(6), as it relates to required "pre booked hire" door signage and the position of the required plates.
- 6. The details of the variation are set out in the application.
- 7. The application further seeks consent to have advertising imagery in the form of lettering covering the entire surface of the interior of the rear facing window of the vehicle.
- 8. The Committee are now familiar with applications of this nature, which have been referred to as Gold Plate applications or Executive Hire applications.
- 9. The purpose as, I understand it, of allowing the exemption is to permit genuine executive hire companies, who exclusively do either that kind of work or exempt hire and reward work, absolute discretion in relation to mandatory (by virtue of standard conditions) signage on Private Hire cars. The primary purpose of the consents previously granted was to allow a clean less obvious but properly licensed Private Hire Car to operate, whilst retaining discreet plates to allow law enforcement agencies to readily identify the vehicle as a properly licensed vehicle.

- 10. The second scenario was to allow the licensing of a significantly unique vehicle that operates in such a way that the primary business of the vehicle was exempt from licensing requirement; however some ancillary work required licensing.
- 11. This application differs from either of these two scenarios, first of all I do not believe that the vehicle and service offered is sufficiently unique in nature to warrant grant of the application to vary on that basis.
- 12. This vehicle is currently operated as a normal and standard private hire car. The applicant does choose to specialise, in higher end journeys such as those to and from airports, weddings, other special events, day trips and tours. In addition the vehicle is enrolled on the School Transport Framework and as such has been used to transport entitled children between home address and school.
- 13. During a telephone enquiry with the applicant he has indicated that the vast majority of his journeys target that longer specialist and executive service type hires. He states he does not offer a service going to and from licensed venues within Clackmannanshire and that short hires are rarely in demand.
- 14. The application indicates he wishes to continue on the School Transport Framework should his application to vary be granted.
- 15. As with other applications of a similar nature I have completed research into the applicant's business model and operation and although there is no doubt that a large part of his business centres on what we now recognises as "Executive Hire". It is not 100% geared to that model.
- 16. I do not believe that School transport contracts could be described as "Executive Hire".
- 17. I further believe that the vision held by Clackmannanshire Council in introducing the concept of a Private Hire Car for "Executive Hire" use was that of an exclusive use for executive work, and the licensing of a premium, discreet car with no outwardly obvious markings or livery that indicates that it is available as a hire car.
- 18. It appears to me that this application seeks to gain the perceived advantage of not having to display external plates and "Pre-Booked Hire" door signs, but retain the advantage of openly advertising its availability and status as a hire car by the display of the graphics on the rear windscreen.
- 19. It is entirely at the discretion of the Regulatory Committee to decide whether to grant all or part of this variation having considered all of the information presented to them.
- 20. The Regulatory Committee, in determining this application may wish to consider whether or not it is necessary to impose local conditions which would prevent the future use of the vehicle as a "normal" private hire car for frequent, short and local journeys.
- 21. A restriction such as local condition imposing a minimum fare for each journey may be an option. If applied it would be desirable that this was an exclusive local condition, thus preventing the vehicle being used for any type of local, short, low fare type journeys. An example of a suitable condition is contained at appendix A
- 22. In the event that variation sought is granted and it is later identified that the vehicle is being used as a "normal" private hire car, then the Regulatory Committee would

also have the option of varying the conditions of the Operators Licence to reinstate the Standard Conditions in full. Schedule 1, paragraph 10 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act, 1982, explains this process which allows the Regulatory committee to vary the conditions of a licence at any time and on any grounds it thinks fit.

- 23. An example of what may be suitable local licence condition is contained at appendix A. The Committee may wish to apply all or some of these conditions in the event that the licence and variation is granted.
- 24. Other than the matter raised in paragraphs 15-18, I have no concerns about this application.

- 1 A record of all journeys/hires relating to the use of the licensed vehicle will be kept by the operator who must make these records available on request for inspection by the Civic Licensing Standards Officer, an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Constable. Record must be retained and available for at least 12 months
- 2 All arrangements made to hire the vehicle must be made in advance of the journey commencing. A minimum fare of £30 will be applied to the any individual journey.
- 3 The gold rear plate supplied by the licensing Authority must be securely and permanently fitted in such a position inside the rear luggage area of the vehicle so that it can be easily shown to the Civic Licensing Standards Officer, an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Constable.
- 4 The gold front plate will be displayed at all times whilst the vehicle is being used as a private hire car in a position on the front nearside, lower portion of the front windscreen so that it is clearly visible and legible from outside the vehicle.







I refer to the above application for the renewal of a Taxi Driver's Licence and in terms of Section 3(1) of Schedule I of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, make the following representation in relation to the application.

Examination of the application form indicated that the applicant has stated that he has been convicted of offences. These convictions have been declared on the application form but require clarification in order to allow the Committee to consider their decision in relation to the application.

To clarify the applicant has been convicted as follows;

The first offence listed occurred in the Cumbria area on 11/12/2017 and it would appear that the original fine imposed was not paid which resulted in the conviction on 17/05/2019. This fine was declared on the application form but the subsequent conviction as above has not. Full details if the circumstances of the offence are not available to Police Scotland as this is an offence which occurred in England.

The circumstances of the second conviction are that at 2026 hours on 13/10/2018 Mr Barr was found to be driving at 48mph in a 30 mph speed limit on the B9096 near to Lornshill Academy, Alloa. 2 letters were sent to the applicant requiring him to provide the identity of the driver of his vehicle at the time of the offence. Having received no reply police attended at the home address of Mr Barr at which time he admitted to having been driving the vehicle. He was issued with a conditional offer of fixed penalty which he failed to comply with. A report was thereafter submitted to the Procurator Fiscal resulting in the above conviction.

This representation is brought to your attention when considering this application.

- 1. In terms of Schedule 1, paragraph 3 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act, 1982 (the Act) I wish to make a representation in relation to the grant of a Taxi Drivers licence and 2 taxi operators licences to Brian Barr,
- 2. This representation asks that the Regulatory Committee consider the information contained in paragraphs 3-11, before coming to a decision as to whether or not these licences should be granted.
- 3. The applicant has declared 2 road traffic convictions on his most recent Taxi Drivers application.
- 4. Due to the nature and circumstances of these convictions, their relatively recent occurrence and their relevancy to the type of licence applied for these applications should not be granted under delegated powers, and should be determined by the Regulatory Committee.
- 5. The first conviction relates to an offence of failing to identify the driver of a motor vehicle at the time of a speeding offence being investigated by the Police. Mr Barr has declared that the penalty imposed was a fine of £660 and 6 penalty points endorsed on his licence
- 6. The second offence relates to speeding at 48 miles per hour in a 30 miles per hour built up area. This offence was committed whilst driving a taxi on route to a uplift a pre booked hire customer. There was not a fare paying passenger in the car at the time
- 7. Other than the applicants explanation the circumstances of the offences are not known to the Civic Licensing Standards. However Police Scotland have provided some additional details.
- 8. On the face of it also appears that the applicant has failed to properly declare details of these convictions on some application forms, as required by the standard conditions of the licence.
- 9. The table at Appendix A to this report shows details of the type, and dates of the various applications lodged in 2018 and 2019 by the applicant, and the final column shows the details of the convictions that were declared on each application. As can be seen the dates of the convictions would indicate that these matters should have been both notified in writing and declared in earlier applications than they first appeared. It may be that the applicant having had the opportunity to examine this table would want to offer some explanation for what appears to be a failure to comply with the conditions of his licences
- 10. I can confirm that soon after Mr Barr received notification of the intended prosecution for the second offence he did contact the CLSO and took advice on the notification process, and

- although this matter was not finally notified in writing on the application dated 27 May, 2019, this was shortly after the date of conviction for the offence, which was in May 2019.
- 11. In summary, this applicant has been convicted within a relatively short period of time, of two motoring offences, which have resulted in endorsements on his licence now totalling 10 penalty points. The offences are both connected with speeding offences, although the first conviction does not identify the applicant as the driver at the time.



The circumstances of the first conviction are that the applicant was stopped by police while driving a motor vehicle and found to have no insurance policy in place for the vehicle.

The circumstances of the second conviction are that the applicant was stopped by police while driving a motor vehicle which had 4 inoperative lights. On further checks being carried out it transpired there was no insurance or MOT in place for the vehicle.

The circumstances of the third conviction are that the applicant was stopped by police while driving a vehicle with no insurance policy in place and with defective tyres.

Police Scotland is of the opinion that, by reason of repeated failure to comply with Road Traffic Law in terms of failing to insure the vehicles he is driving and failure to ensure the upkeep of the vehicles he is driving the applicant is not a fit and proper person to be granted a Taxi Driver's Licence, and in terms of Section 3(1) of Schedule 1 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, objects to the granting of such a licence.

Having carried out the required tests as detailed in the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exclusions and Exceptions)(Scotland) Amendment Order 2015, it has been established that the applicant has a number of spent convictions, which are considered 'protected' in terms of the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974. It is the Chief Constable's contention that justice cannot be done in this case except by admitting evidence relating the 'protected' convictions.

I must emphasise that this letter is for the information of the Regulatory Committee, solely in connection with this application and not for any other purpose.

Civic Government (Scotland) Act, 1982 **Application for Taxi Drivers Licence** Stephen Honeyman,

- 1. In terms of Schedule 1, paragraph 3 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act, 1982 (the Act) I wish to make a representation in relation to the grant of a Taxi Drivers licence to Stephen Honeyman,
- 2. This representation asks that the Regulatory Committee consider the information contained in paragraphs 3-12, before coming to a decision as to whether or not Stephen Honey (the applicant) is a fit and proper person to be granted a Taxi Drivers Licence.
- 3. The applicant has declared 2 road traffic convictions on his application. Due to the nature and circumstances of these convictions, their relatively recent occurrence and their relevancy to the type of licence applied for this application should not be granted under delegated powers, and should be determined by the Regulatory Committee.
- 4. One of the matters declared (Code IN10) relates to driving a motor vehicle on a road whilst not insured. A discussion with the applicant reveals that this offence was committed whilst driving a minibus full of passengers. The applicant claims that he was simply doing a favour for a local operator and the passengers were not paying customers. I have no further specific information about the offence.
- 5. The other matter declared (Code TT99) does not identify the actual nature of the conviction and simply relates to the special DVLA Code applied to a person's driving licence when they have accrued so many penalty points in a 3 year period that he or she has been disqualified from driving under the "Totting" up procedure.
- 6. During the discussion with the applicant he was unable or unwilling to reveal the nature of the convictions that resulted in his disqualification.
- 7. The applicant has failed to provide me with a DVLA Enquiry code relating to his driver record, and as such I have been unable to verify the convictions as declared.
- 8. During the telephone discussion which took place as part of the consultation process the applicant was evasive when asked about specific details of the driving offences and stated categorically that he had no other convictions that he should declare on his application.

- 9. I have since learned that Police Scotland hold details of a number of other convictions that should have been declared on the application lodged by Mr Honeyman.
- 10. There is no purpose served or benefit to the Regulatory Committee in my making further enquiry into these matters as I am aware that Police Scotland intend to object to the licence application.
- 11. In summary, this applicant has been recently convicted within a relatively short period of time, on number separate occasions, of motoring offences so serious that it has resulted in his disqualification.
- 12. I am aware of the content of the Police objection which clearly shows that the applicant has engaged in an extended pattern of behaviour in relation to driving habits decisions that has no doubt placed other road users at risk.

With regards to my application for a Taxi Drivers Badge. I have been invited to attend the Regulatory Committee Meeting on the 19th September, 2019 where my application will be heard.

After having the opportunity to read the report by the Licensing Standards Officer which you will have, or soon have in your possession! would like to take this moment to clarify some of the major points and facts for your consideration before my application is heard.

I have attached a copy of my licence details for your perusal and as you can see the expired IN10 offence is what the LSO is mostly concerned about which is driving a vehicle without proper insurance.

This lack of insurance was not deliberately made by myself but in fact made by the owner of the vehicle whom I borrowed it from for a family function. I would like to stress and clarify that the said vehicle was empty of people and not for Hire or Reward at the time of the Police check.

The LSO was made fully aware of this during a telephone call regarding the incident explaining the usage of the vehicle at the time of the offence and how the IN10 offence was generated. As you can see this offence was five years ago and has now expired from my license but unfortunately has not yet considered to be a spent offence and so must be submitted during my application of a taxi drivers' licence.

During a conversation with the LSO, I was advised that I did not need to provide an access code for my driving license at the point of application. After further consultation it was deemed and then decided that the best course of action was to provide this code which I diligently presented to Kilncraigs on the 6th August 2019 hence the explanation of the IN10 offence.

I have also been informed from the LSO that Police Scotland intend to raise an objection which I cannot comment on as it is unknown to me what this objection is about as no further information has been revealed to me.

Lastly and most importantly, I must stress my deepest apologies for this application to be so drawn out due to misunderstandings and confusing advice. I also desire to stress that I do not condone driving without insurance which I felt embarrassed, ashamed and guilty when the Police Officer explained that I was not a named driver on the owner's insurance policy. I will now endeavour to fully check that I am genuinely insured on the actual policy with any future employers that I may work for if my licence is granted on the 19th by the committee.
