1.0 SUMMARY

1.1. This report shows progress against the indicators contained in the Corporate Plan, which was approved by Council in June of this year.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1. It is recommended that the committee note the report.

3.0 BACKGROUND

- 3.1. The Corporate Plan was approved by Council on 5 June 2008. The plan sets out the Council's nine priority outcomes, which are derived from the Single Outcome Agreement. Underpinning the priority outcomes are 72 indicators, with associated targets for the period 2008-11. Performance against the 72 targets are to be reported to Scrutiny Committee twice yearly.
- 3.2. A number of the indicators cannot be reported on at this time as baselines are to be set this year. Once baselines have been set, targets can be established for future years and then performance can be reported upon thereafter. In addition, some indicators can only be reported upon after the year end. In both of these cases, performance is shown as "n/a".
- 3.3. Where performance is reported, it is shown as either "On track or exceeding target" or "Not meeting target". Of these indicators, 86% are reported to be on track or exceeding target and only 14% not meeting target at the half year point.
- 3.4. Performance at the half year stage against all corporate plan targets is shown in the appendix to this paper. The overall position may be summarised as follows:
