How do I store my bike at home?

Keep your bike out of sight - more than half of all bikes stolen are taken from the owner's property.

How do I protect my bike?

- Always lock your bike when you leave it unattended
- Where possible, lock your bike to something solid like a lamp post or railing
- If your wheels come off easily, remove the front wheel and lock it into the frame and the back wheel.
